Giving O'Brien the bad news, Eddie explains, "your electrical system definitely has a problem. It could be the headlight switch. It could be the headlight relay. It could be the wiring. Or, it could be all of the above. And, by the way, your battery is all corroded. You really should have it replaced." As expected, O'Brien asks, "how much will it cost to fix?" Eddie gives O'Brien a range of what it would likely cost, and asks, "do you want us to take a look at it?" O'Brien asks, "that's too expensive. Is there a cheaper way to fix it?" Eddie replies, "yeah. You can relabel your headlight switch to read 'off - dim - flicker'. Or, you can ask Santa Claus for a new car."

Knowing that his car has a considerable number of problems, O'Brien asks Eddie, "by the way, how much is a brake job?" Eddie replies, "it depends on what's wrong with them. What's it doing?" O'Brien replies, "it's not stopping too good." Wondering why O'Brien is so full of questions today, Eddie replies, "that's definitely not good. Did you want me to take a look at it?" O'Brien replies, "not today. I have to get to work." Eddie tells O'Brien, "that's okay. If the brakes won't stop the car, something else eventually will stop it."

O'Brien, as dumb as he is, now realizes that Eddie is messing with him. O'Brien tells Eddie, "I think I'll get that other guy to look at it." Eddie replies, "no problem. Go ahead." Eddie is sure that Jake will have a few unique and interesting solutions to O'Brien's automotive problems. O'Brien gets back in his car, and Eddie wishes him a merry Christmas. Seeing a few drips of fresh oil on the ground as O'Brien drives off, Eddie shakes his head, and gets back to work.

Christmas Eve brings the entire tribe together, but not on the track. Eddie and Kathy drive into the church parking lot and, walking toward the newly completed church, Kathy tells Eddie, "the church is really beautiful! Everyone did a really great job!" Eddie replies, "the last time I saw the inside, nothing was finished out." Kathy points out, "your dad did a really great job on the parking lot and the grounds." Eddie looks around for his parent's car, and replies, "I wonder if my mom and dad are here yet."

The church building, constructed by Eddie's father, Mark's father, and Mark, is built out of steel, concrete, and stone. The workers took the

building materials, applied their skill, and built a beautiful cathedral, far better than Dr. Akinmola ever expected. By working on the building, Bobby B., Erika, and Tessa learned some valuable building skills. Mark, responsible for the majority of the stone and brick work, is now an expert stone mason. Even Dr. Akinmola got his hands dirty on this project, helping out wherever he can.

Walking through the door into the narthex, Eddie and Kathy are greeted by Adekunle Akinmola, who tells Eddie, “merry Christmas, my friend!” Eddie and Kathy both reply, “merry Christmas!” Akinmola tells Eddie, “I can’t tell you how happy my father is today. He’s been waiting for this day for five years.” Eddie replies, “I’m glad the building is all done.” Akinmola tells Eddie, “it was finished right on time! God’s timing!”

Eddie’s father and mother walk up, wishing Eddie and Kathy a merry Christmas. Eddie’s mother, Nina, asks Kathy, “are your mom and dad here yet?” Kathy replies, “I don’t know. We just got here.” Eddie comments, “here they come.” Kathy’s parents walk up, wishing everyone, “merry Christmas!” Hugs and kisses are exchanged, as Mark and Paula join the group. Giving Mark a fist bump, Eddie tells Mark, “merry Christmas! The building looks pretty good, bro. Maybe I’ll have you build something for me.” Mark replies, “as long as it’s next year. I have to work on the track across the street first. That has to be done before the Spring.”

Walking up to Eddie and Mark is Mayor Bradford Jamieson, the mayor of the town where Eddie and Mark live. The mayor puts on a perky smile, and asks Eddie and Mark, “so, am I correct in understanding that you guys are our local track stars?” Not recognizing the man, Mark replies, “yeah. That’s us. Who are you?” The mayor, realizing he was being a bit rude, replies, “I’m so sorry. I failed to introduce myself. I am Mayor Jamieson.” Eddie tells the mayor, “merry Christmas.” The mayor tells Eddie and Mark, “merry Christmas.”

Wondering how the mayor knows who he and Eddie are, Mark informs the mayor, “a lot of other track stars are planning to be here tonight too.” Eddie tells Mark, “speaking of track stars, here comes Braden and Wendy.” Mayor Jamieson asks, “oh, so that’s Officer Braden?” Mark replies, “yeah. That’s him.” Eddie wonders how Mayor Jamieson knows that Braden is a police officer. And, Mark potentially found someone new to mess with.

With many people expected to be in attendance, the group walks into the sanctuary together to get a good seat. Within fifteen minutes, the whole tribe is seated in the same area, along with many of their parents. While they are waiting, Eddie asks Mark, “what’s up with the mayor?” Kathy also asks, “yeah, seriously. What’s up with that guy? And, how did he know that you guys ran track?” Eddie replies, “I don’t know. I didn’t even know our town had a mayor. And, how did that guy know that

Braden is a police officer?" Paula comments, "if you ask me, the mayor is kind of spooky. It's kind of weird that he knew who Mark and Eddie are." Yanking Paula's chain, Kathy tells her, "that's really nothing to worry about. He's probably just your everyday garden variety axe murderer." Paula exclaims, "stop it, girl! It's Christmas!" Kathy smiles, knowing exactly what buttons to press to set Paula off.

Dr. Akinmola walks up and, standing in front of the altar, opens the service by announcing, "merry Christmas!" The congregation responds in unison, "merry Christmas!" Dr. Akinmola replies, "that it is, my brothers. That it is!" Dr. Akinmola instructs the congregation, "please turn in your hymnals to hymn number 139, *O Little Town of Bethlehem.*" The organist begins to play, and the congregation sings along with the choir.

Following the hymn, Dr. Akinmola opens with a prayer, then speaks, "in the Gospel according to Luke, in chapter two, verses one through seven, we read, 'In those days, Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire inhabited Earth. And, everyone went to his own town to register. So, Joseph also went up from the city of Nazareth in Galilee, to Judea, to Bethlehem, the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was engaged to him, and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped Him in cloths and placed Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.'"

Dr. Akinmola then announces, "please turn in your hymnals to hymn number 144, *What Child is This.*" The organist begins to play, and the congregation sings along with the choir. Eddie takes particular notice of how good the organ sounds. The Flentrop pipe organ, which took a lot of time and trouble to procure, while small, has a very distinct tonal quality to it.

Dr. Akinmola continues to read from the Gospel of Luke, "And, there were shepherds working in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks during the night. An angel of the Lord appeared before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But, the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. Behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today, in the town of David, a Savior has been born to you, who is Christ the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger.'"

Dr. Akinmola then announces, "please turn in your hymnals to hymn number 145, *The First Noel.*" The organist begins to play, and the congregation sings along with the choir.

The service continues, as Dr. Akinmola narrates the Christmas story as told in the Gospel of Luke. While Dr. Akinmola is speaking, Kathy whispers to Eddie, “don’t look now, but the mayor has been looking over the entire track team since the service started.” Eddie whispers back, “where is he seated?” Kathy whispers to Eddie, “on the other side of the aisle, in our row.” Eddie casually glances over, seeing that the mayor is not paying one bit of attention to the service. Observing the mayor for a few minutes, Eddie whispers to Kathy, “that guy is a stalker. He’s checking everybody out, not only the track team.”

Following Dr. Akinmola’s reading of scripture, the elders approach the altar, obtaining the offering plates. The Christmas offering is taken up, as the soloist, accompanied by the organ, sings *O Holy Night*. During the offering, Mark whispers to Paula, “everything’s working.” Paula whispers back, asking, “what do you mean?” Mark whispers, “the lights are all working, the heat just kicked in, the organ works, and all that kind of stuff.” To some degree, today’s Christmas service is a test drive for the building that Mark has been working on for the last year.

Also, during the offering, Eddie and Kathy watch the mayor out of the corner of their eyes. The mayor not only frequently looks over at the track team, but at other people as well. One thing is for certain. The mayor is not paying one bit of attention to the service, leaving Kathy and Eddie wondering why he is even present.

The elders walk up the center aisle, and place the offering upon the altar. Next, taking the bread and wine for communion from the altar, the elders distribute the elements to the congregation. The elders return to the altar, and Dr. Akinmola proclaims, “The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, ‘this is My body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of Me.’” The congregation eats the bread, followed by Dr. Akinmola proclaiming, “In the same way He also took the cup, after supper, saying, ‘This cup is the new covenant in My blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.’” Finishing Holy Communion, Dr. Akinmola proclaims, “For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death until He comes.”

Dr. Akinmola’s son, Adekunle, stands in front of the congregation, and proclaims, “tonight we light our last candle in the Advent Wreath to remember the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, which we come together to celebrate this Christmas Eve. As the prophets prophesied long ago, the Lord Jesus Christ came to Earth and, like the shepherds, we are filled with wonder and amazement.” Dr. Akinmola’s daughter, Sade, with her mother by her side, lights the Advent candle.

Dr. Akinmola then proclaims, “Lord Jesus, You come as a tiny, fragile baby. Yet, we know that You are God and you are with us. May the flame of this candle remind us that You are the light of the world and that, if we follow You, we will never walk in darkness, but will have the true light of life. We look forward to that day when You will come again and we will behold You face to face with all the angels of heaven.” The congregation responds, “come, Lord Jesus, come. Amen.”

The lights of the sanctuary are dimmed, as Adekunle and Sade light their candles from the white candle on the Advent Wreath. Walking down the center aisle side by side, Adekunle and Sade transfer the flame of their candle to that of the person sitting at the end of the pew. As the congregation sings *Silent Night*, each person transfers the flame of their candle to the next in the pew. The sanctuary is again illuminated, this time by the light of everyone’s candles.

When the last verse of *Silent Night* has been completed, everyone blows out their candles, and wishes those around them a merry Christmas. Eddie and Kathy wish each other a merry Christmas, giving each other a Christmas hug, and sneaking in a merry Christmas kiss. The tribe, their parents, and friends all wish each other a merry Christmas. Dr. Akinmola mingles with the congregation, personally wishing everyone a merry Christmas.

Those present from the track team wish each other a merry Christmas, and talk about their plans over the holiday season. Braden and Wendy plan to visit both set of parents tomorrow. Barbara and Johnson will be spending a lot of time together and getting some training in. Bobby B. and Erika will be enjoying the holiday food on a cruise ship, and hitting the ship’s weight room quite often. And, Karen will be driving home tomorrow morning, and will stay until her mother blows a gasket, which should be within a few hours of when Karen walks through the door.

Dr. Akinmola comes up to Eddie, wishing him, “merry Christmas!” Eddie replies, “merry Christmas. The service was beautiful!” Dr. Akinmola tells Eddie, “thank you so much, my friend, for buying the organ for the church. That organ has the most beautiful sound to it.” Eddie replies, “I told you it would sound awesome.” Dr. Akinmola asks, “how did you know how the organ would sound before it got here?” Eddie explains, “I was listening to a classical album with a friend of mine. The organ sounded really awesome. This is that organ.” Dr. Akinmola smiles, and replies, “I’m just glad, my friend, that it came across the Atlantic Ocean in one piece.” The organ actually came across the Atlantic Ocean in several hundred pieces, and reassembled by experts when it arrived.

Standing within earshot of Eddie and Dr. Akinmola’s conversation is Mayor Jamieson, who has surmised that Eddie donated the money for the

church to purchase the organ. Walking away with the details of the conversation, the mayor wonders how someone who is employed as an auto mechanic has the money to purchase a pipe organ. But, Mayor Jamieson is not too surprised. He has already discovered through his sly detective work who purchased the land on which the church sits.

As they are getting ready to leave, Kathy's parents again wish Eddie and Kathy a merry Christmas. Kathy tells her mother, "we'll see you tomorrow!" Kathy's mother tells Kathy, "oh, and I made chocolate mousse." Kathy replies, "oh, good! I'll be sure not to spoil my dessert!"

Eddie's parents walk over to join the group, again wishing everyone a merry Christmas. Eddie's mother tells everyone, "we're really looking forward to seeing everyone tomorrow!" Eddie's mother then tells Kathy, "oh, and I made your favorite dessert!" Eddie tells Kathy, "wow! Aren't you special this year." Kathy smiles, knowing that she will get chocolate mousse for dessert at lunch and dinner. Kathy and Eddie then head out, only to meet up again with their parents tomorrow.

Kathy and Eddie sit in the car for a moment. Kathy mentions, "that was a wonderful Christmas service." Eddie replies, "yeah. It was. And, everything worked." Kathy tells Eddie, "Paula was saying a week ago that Mark was worried that something would go wrong. But, it didn't." Eddie replies, "I guess it's like test flying an airplane."

Abruptly changing the subject, Eddie points out, "it looks like the mayor is sitting in his car, taking notes." Kathy asks, "really? Where's he parked?" Eddie replies, "he's parked under the middle light near the entrance. He's writing stuff down." Kathy laughs, and tells Eddie, "maybe he's taking notes on who's been naughty or nice." Eddie laughs and drives away, wondering why the mayor was acting kind of odd all evening.

The day after Christmas, Eddie and Kathy head out to the airport, going on another Christmas cruise in the Carribean. Joining them again this year is Mark and Paula. This year, since Mark gave Bobby B. a week off, with pay, Bobby B. and Erika will also be joining the group. With a gym and jogging track on the cruise ship, everyone will feel right at home.
